1. This letter reports completion of the preliminary inquiry conducted in accordance with reference (a) and enclosure (1) into the facts and circumstances surrounding a voice report made on 10 August of possible inappropriate behavior by CAPT Tadd Gorman, USN, Commanding Officer, USS ANTIETAM during a port visit in Manila, Philippines.

4. Summary of findings:

a. USS ANTIETAM conducted a port visit to Manila, Philippines from 7 to 11 August 2019. On the morning of 10 August, I received a phone call from [REDACTED] (b) (6), (b) (7)(C)

(b) (6), (b) (7)(C) USS ANTIETAM reporting that (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) had contacted (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and claimed that (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) he was having an affair with (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) USS ANTIETAM. Myself, Commander, Carrier Strike Group FIVE and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) USS ANTIETAM both made several unsuccessful attempts to contact CAPT Gorman on his cell phones. You directed me to travel to USS ANTIETAM to investigate the report of possible misconduct.

b. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated that he intended to talk to CAPT Gorman following the port visit about perceptions of his behavior towards (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). These included appearing to only be in CIC when she was on watch, standing next to her during UNREP evolutions while she is the CONN officer when he is not observed to stand with other CONN officers. This behavior was also commented on by the (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). He also intended to discuss with CAPT Gorman not being reachable while in liberty ports (not answering his phone when called) and a follow up conversation as a result of his behavior during the previous port visit which was investigated separately.

c. On 7 July, CAPT Gorman assigned the USS ANTIETAM (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) to be his liberty buddy. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) was told by the USS ANTIETAM (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) that he was assigned to be the CO's liberty buddy to make sure the CO did not drink too much alcohol and to keep the CO out of trouble. Although (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) did not describe the specifics to (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) he explained that the CO had a previous liberty incident involving the consumption of an excessive amount of alcohol. CAPT Gorman and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) left the ship around 1600 and proceeded to the Makati area of Manila. They went shopping at Landmark Department Store and ate dinner at Dillinger's Restaurant. Following dinner (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) walked CAPT Gorman back to CAPT Gorman's hotel. CAPT Gorman had reservations at Shangri-La Hotel from 7-10 August. CAPT Gorman checked into his hotel and then returned to the ship. The deck logs show CAPT Gorman returning to the ship at 2140. The (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) were all on the ship the night of 7 August but none of them interacted with the CO upon his return from liberty that night. CAPT Gorman stated that he returned to the ship because he forgot his bag when he departed for liberty. He claimed he remained onboard the ship instead of returning to his hotel because of a long day on the bridge as well as being up while combating a material casualty the previous night. In verifying his statement a review of the deck logs also revealed that he is seldom on the bridge during underway operations.

d. CAPT Gorman departed the ship on 8 August at 0943 and did not return to the ship until 10 August at 1254. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) were liberty buddies from 8-10 August and both had a room at Raffles Hotel in Makati. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) invited CAPT Gorman to join them on liberty at a brewery in Makati in the afternoon on 8 August. The three spent the rest of the afternoon and evening at the brewery. At the end of the evening, the three shared a ride back to their hotels. Neither (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) nor (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) observed CAPT Gorman behaving inappropriately on 8 August. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) estimates that CAPT Gorman drank approximately five beers at the brewery and was drunk but was not excessively intoxicated, did not appear "black-out" drunk.

e. On 9 August, (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) states that she and CAPT Gorman made plans to meet up for lunch at Shangri-La Hotel and then go shopping for “smart casual attire” to wear during an Embassy reception scheduled for 10 August. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) states she met up with CAPT Gorman around noon and they ate lunch but decided not to go shopping and stayed at Shangri-La for the rest of the day.

f. Around 1300 on 9 August (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) reported that CAPT Gorman contacted him via text message and asked him to join him and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) at Shangri-La for food and drinks. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) met them at Shangri-La at 1345; CAPT Gorman and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) were already seated at a table. The three continued to eat and drink until 1900 when (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) left to return to his hotel. CAPT Gorman and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) remained at Shangri-La drinking until just before midnight when (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) states that she left to return to her hotel prior to the expiration of liberty at 2400. CAPT Gorman remained at Shangri-La. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and LCDR (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) estimate that CAPT Gorman had at least 9 beers during the time they were with him. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) states that he did not observe any inappropriate behavior by CAPT Gorman toward (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) on 9 August prior to leaving them at 1900. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) observed that CAPT Gorman was quite drunk and fell asleep at the table at one point. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) states that the group spent most of the day sitting around the table drinking beers, joking around and swapping sea stories. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated that she did not observe any inappropriate behavior on the part of CAPT Gorman on 9 August. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated that she assumed CAPT Gorman had a room at the Shangri-La the night of 9 August, but did not know where he went after she left.

g. When asked about his activities on 9 August, CAPT Gorman initially stated that he spent the day by himself and did not have any liberty buddies. When pressed on this matter, CAPT Gorman acknowledged that there were likely other people around that he saw but that he did not specifically make any liberty plans with anyone. He claimed he did not recall contacting (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) to invite him to join him and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) in the bar, however he did clarify he and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) had made plans to go shopping, but that they changed their plans once in the bar. CAPT Gorman states that he attempted to get a room at the Shangri-La but was unable to do so because they were booked. He did not explain why he had cancelled the room he already had reserved for that night earlier in the day. He also states that he lost both his government issued Japanese cell phone and his Filipino “burner” cell phone he was issued for the port visit. Ship records indicate that CAPT Gorman also lost the wifi puck he was issued for this port visit. CAPT Gorman states that he spent the rest of the night moving between various public areas of the Shangri-La hotel, to include checking the lost and found for his cell phones and spending time at a lounge by the pool. CAPT Gorman admits that his description of his whereabouts and activity on 9-10 August appears sketchy but claims the situation was not as sketchy as it sounds. He attempted to clarify his statement, encl (7) that he had no liberty buddies and was alone, despite the statements by (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) that they spent the majority of the day with him.

h. CAPT Gorman’s initial difficulty in explaining his whereabouts and actions on 9 and 10 August can potentially be attributed to his consuming an excessive amount of alcohol on 9 August (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) estimated at least 7 drinks over the 5 hours he was present and an unknown quantity before he arrived and after he left). CAPT Gorman appeared disheveled and

had blood shot eyes around 1330/1400 when I initially met with him on the ship. He was still less than coherent 3 hours later when I interviewed him. His choices the night of 9 August might be the result of alcohol and not indicative of an improper relationship. However, there is no corroborating evidence to support CAPT Gorman's statement, nor is there corroborating evidence that (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) went back to her room alone.

i. This preliminary investigation did not identify any concrete evidence of an inappropriate relationship between CAPT Gorman and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). I asked both CAPT Gorman and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) directly whether they have ever engaged in an inappropriate relationship and both officers adamantly denied the existence of such a relationship.

Subj: SUMMARY OF STATEMENT FROM [REDACTED]

1. On 10 and 12 August 2019, as Preliminary Inquiry Officer, I interviewed [REDACTED] USN, about his knowledge of the possible inappropriate behavior involving USS ANTIETAM officers during a port visit to Manila, Philippines from 7-10 August 2019.
2. [REDACTED] is the [REDACTED] on USS ANTIETAM.
3. [REDACTED] stated that while [REDACTED] was CO of ANTIETAM, the CO, XO and CMC would always form a liberty group. Under CAPT Gorman's command, XO has never been CO's liberty buddy. CO does not answer XO's phone calls during port visits. On one occasion, XO could not get in touch with the CO so XO called the Command Duty Officer and asked the Command Duty Officer to call the CO. The CO answered the Command Duty Officer's call but later told the XO that he had lost his cell phone and that is why he did not answer the XO's phone call.
4. [REDACTED] states that [REDACTED] was the CO's liberty buddy the first night in Manila, 7 August 2019. The idea to assign [REDACTED] to serve as the CO's liberty buddy was the CO's idea. CO left the ship with [REDACTED] but returned to the ship and spent the first night in port on the ship, despite having a hotel room at the Shangri-La. [REDACTED] also stated that [REDACTED] was on duty the first night in port and [REDACTED] roommate was not on the ship the first night in port.
5. [REDACTED] expressed relief to be interviewed for this investigation. He stated that the nature of his relationship with the CO has changed since he and CMC confronted CO about his liberty behavior during the last port visit. Following that conversation, CO has been more withdrawn and mostly ignores the XO and CMC. [REDACTED] expressed that he now views everything the CO does through the lens of the possibility that CO has an unduly familiar relationship with the [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] believe he has become more sensitive to observing CO and [REDACTED] interactions.
6. [REDACTED] indicated that [REDACTED] is in CO's stateroom more than other department heads, but that might be because of her position. [REDACTED] also indicated that [REDACTED] interactions with CO are different than other department heads and that [REDACTED] expects the CO to back her up in interactions with the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] discussed an UNREP in which CO stood directly behind [REDACTED] while she served as the conning officer, although he normally sits in his chair during UNREPs.
7. When asked about discussions with CO about the plan for Manila port visit, [REDACTED] stated that after CMC and he asked CO several times, he finally indicated he was staying at the Shangri-La hotel. XO stayed on the ship and did not try to contact the CO by phone on 7, 8, or 9 August and CO did not try to contact him. When XO tried to contact CO on 10 August regarding [REDACTED], he was unable to get in touch with him.

Subj: SUMMARY OF STATEMENT FROM (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) USN

1. On 10 and 12 August 2019, as Preliminary Inquiry Officer, I interviewed (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) USN, about his knowledge of the possible inappropriate behavior involving USS ANTIETAM officers during a port visit to Manila, Philippines from 7-10 August 2019.
2. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) is the (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) on USS ANTIETAM.
3. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated that under the previous Commanding Officer, (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) for all ANT port visits, the CO, XO and CMC would form a liberty buddy group. Since CAPT Gorman assumed command, the CMC has only gone on liberty one time with the CO, the 1st day of the port visit to Thailand. . CMC has suggested to CO that they stay at the same hotel during ANTIETAMs port visits but CO never responded to CMC and is generally evasive about his liberty plans.
4. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) has observed several instances of behavior between CO and the (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) that appeared strange to him. CO frequently spends more time in Combat while (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) is on watch than other officers. CO also sits closer to (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) while she is on watch than he sits next to anyone else in Combat and he sits facing her in an unusual way vice the LSD. The CMC attends church each Sunday along with the CO. CMC always sits in the back row next to the door and the CO never asked him to move to the front row. The one instance that (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) attended church, the CO invited (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and the CMC to sit in the front row. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) sat next to Captain. Additionally, CO seems keenly invested in (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) professional development.
5. ANTIETAM does not maintain liberty sign out logs, they use the PASCAC system. Personnel are required to swipe their CAC upon leaving on and returning from liberty but they do not sign out with their liberty buddies.
6. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated that following the discussion in July that XO and CMC had with CO regarding his liberty behavior during the last port visit to Manila, CO gives CMC the impression that CMC's presence and advice is merely "tolerated."
7. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) intended to address the multiple lines of bearing that raised his suspicion that the CO may be on the verge of an inappropriate relationship with the (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) after the August Manila port visit.
8. When asked to clarify his intent to discuss the lines of bearing the CO was displaying, (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) explained that the CO disclosed on to him that he received a (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) on August 5 for his actions in during ANTIETAM's initial port visit to Manila in July. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) wanted to help him see the reasons why outside individuals might perceive his actions to be leading down the wrong direction: the initial incident on 13 July, emails from (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) to

CMC stating that he had asked [REDACTED], CO's refusal to answer phone calls from [REDACTED] or from XO. CMC also personally observed CO's tendency to always be in combat while [REDACTED] was on duty and rarely be in combat during any other officer's watch rotation. CMC expressed that this situation is exhausting and has got to stop.

Subj: SUMMARY OF STATEMENT FROM [REDACTED] SC, USN

1. On 10 August 2019, as Preliminary Inquiry Officer, I interviewed [REDACTED] USN, about his knowledge of the possible inappropriate behavior involving USS ANTIETAM officers during a port visit to Manila, Philippines from 7-10 August 2019.

2. [REDACTED] is the [REDACTED] on USS ANTIETAM.

3. Prior to the August Manila port visit, [REDACTED] was off the ship for approximately one month for paternity leave. Prior to returning to the ship, [REDACTED] was informed that he was selected to be CO's liberty buddy. [REDACTED] was not excited about the assignment as CO's liberty buddy because he was planning to spend time with family that intended to visit him in Manila. [REDACTED] spoke to [REDACTED] and explained that [REDACTED] job as CO's liberty buddy is to make sure CO does not drink too much alcohol and to keep CO out of trouble. While [REDACTED] does not know the specifics of any previous incidents involving the CO on liberty, he has heard vague rumblings about a previous liberty incident.

4. On the first day in port, [REDACTED] met the ship at the pier and spent a few hours catching up on email and other work. [REDACTED] met the CO on the quarterdeck at 1630 and the CO's driver took them both to Makati. CO did not bring a bag with him and told [REDACTED] he planned to return to the ship later that evening to make phone calls. [REDACTED] and CO went shopping at Landmark Department Store and then ate dinner at Dillinger's restaurant. Following dinner, [REDACTED] walked CO back to his hotel, the Shangri-La, and then [REDACTED] met up with the [REDACTED], and continued with liberty for the night.

5. [REDACTED] stated that it did not appear as though the CO wanted to be his liberty buddy. The CO was preoccupied with his phone for most of dinner and he appeared to be actively texting with someone, although [REDACTED] does not know who CO was texting with.

6. Although [REDACTED] was on standby waiting for the CO to call to meet him for liberty the following two days, CO never called him and [REDACTED] instead spent time with his family.

7. [REDACTED] stated that when CO left the ship for liberty on the first night in Manila he did have his Philippine "burner" cell phone with him. At the time of this interview, [REDACTED] has not collected the burner cell phones.

Subj: SUMMARY OF STATEMENT FROM [REDACTED] USN

1. On 10 and 12 August 2019, as Preliminary Inquiry Officer, I interviewed [REDACTED] USN, about his knowledge of the possible inappropriate behavior involving USS ANTIETAM officers during a port visit to Manila, Philippines from 7-10 August 2019.
2. [REDACTED] is the [REDACTED] on USS ANTIETAM.
3. Prior to the August Manila port visit, [REDACTED] was involved in a group facebook message with other department heads discussing who would be CO's liberty buddy. According to [REDACTED] was selected to be CO's liberty buddy. [REDACTED] was on duty the night of 13 July 2019 so he was not present at dinner with the CO but he is aware that CO consumed too much alcohol and behaved inappropriately. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] that [REDACTED] job as CO's liberty buddy is to make sure CO does not drink too much alcohol and to keep CO out of trouble.
4. [REDACTED] was on duty the first night in port and he stated that he found it odd when CO was announced as returning to the ship because he knew the CO had a hotel room reservation. [REDACTED] liberty buddy for the second and third nights in port was [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] invited CO to join them on liberty at a brewery. CO joined [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] at the brewery and the group hung out for several hours. At the end of the evening, CO, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] shared a private taxi back to their hotels. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] went to Raffles, and CO went back to his hotel, Shangri-La.
5. On the third afternoon in port, 9 August, CO contacted [REDACTED] on facebook messenger and requested that [REDACTED] come to the lounge at the Shangri-La. When [REDACTED] arrived at the Shangri-La, around 1345, CO and [REDACTED] were already seated together in the lounge. [REDACTED] joined CO and [REDACTED] and the three of them hung out in the hotel bar until approximately 1900 when [REDACTED] felt ill and decided to go back to his hotel. [REDACTED] the Shangri-La where the CO and [REDACTED] remained together.
6. The next time [REDACTED] saw [REDACTED] was on the morning of 10 August after XO directed [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] to report back to ANTIETAM. [REDACTED] does not know where CO stayed the night of 9 August.
7. [REDACTED] stated that following the July Manila port visit, when the department heads became aware that the CO had an incident on liberty, the atmosphere on the ship was awkward for several days. While the tradition on ANTIETAM was for the department heads to huddle with the CO in his stateroom in the evening, this did not happen for several days after the July Manila port visit. [REDACTED] has also observed the CO treat [REDACTED] differently than other officers, to include coaching her much more directly when she serves as conning officer than he ever does with other officers.

8. When asked for more details about the CO's behavior on 8 and 9 August, [REDACTED] (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) expressed that he did not observe any inappropriate behavior between the CO and [REDACTED] (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). He observed that the CO was drunk but he did not appear to be handsy or flirtatious with [REDACTED] (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). [REDACTED] (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) estimates that CO consumed about 4 or 5 beers on 8 August and about 5-7 beers between 1345 and 1900 on 9 August. [REDACTED] (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) stated that himself, CO and [REDACTED] (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) spent those interactions sitting around a table, drinking, joking around and sharing sea stories.

9. This memorandum accurately summarizes the conversations between [REDACTED] (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) and [REDACTED] (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) on 10 and 12 August-2019.

Subj: SUMMARY OF STATEMENT FROM [REDACTED] USN

1. On 10 and 12 August 2019, as Preliminary Inquiry Officer, I interviewed [REDACTED] USN, about her knowledge of the possible inappropriate behavior involving USS ANTIETAM officers during a port visit to Manila, Philippines from 7-10 August 2019.
2. [REDACTED] is the [REDACTED] on USS ANTIETAM.
3. [REDACTED] had duty the first night in Manila, 7 August. She does not know why the CO came back to the ship that night.
4. [REDACTED] stayed at Raffles hotel on 8 and 9 August. Her liberty buddy was [REDACTED].
5. On Thursday 8 August [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] spent the afternoon hanging out at a brewery. [REDACTED] called the CO and invited him to join her and [REDACTED] at the brewery. CO joined the group and they spent the rest of the afternoon and evening hanging out at the brewery. At the end of the night, the driver of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] took the CO back to his hotel and then the driver took [REDACTED] back to their hotel.
6. [REDACTED] made plans with the CO to meet up on Friday 9 August to eat burgers for lunch at Shangri-La and then proceed to the mall to go shopping for smart casual attire for the Embassy Reception that was scheduled for Saturday 10 August. [REDACTED] met up with CO at Shangri-La around noon and they ate lunch. They decided not to go shopping and stayed at Shangri-La for the entire day.
7. CO contacted [REDACTED] around 1300 and invited him to join CO and [REDACTED] at Shangri-La. [REDACTED] arrived around 1330 and stayed with CO and [REDACTED] until 1930. [REDACTED] left to return to his hotel room. [REDACTED] stayed out with the CO at the Shangri-La hotel bar until the band stopped playing shortly before midnight. [REDACTED] left Shangri-La and returned to her hotel around midnight.
8. On Saturday morning 10 August, [REDACTED] organized a departmental brunch with her division officers. During brunch she was informed by [REDACTED] that the XO directed [REDACTED] and the [REDACTED] to return to the ship.
9. When asked for more details about her interactions with CO on 8 and 9 August, [REDACTED] explained that, unlike the night of 13 July, CO was not "handsy", flirtatious or in any way inappropriate towards her. She estimates that he drank 2 or 3 beers on 8 August and 7 to 8 beers on 9 August. [REDACTED] adamantly denies having an inappropriate relationship with CO and when asked why she thought someone would speculate one exists, she responded that whoever would speculate that such a relationship exists, would be making that assumption

because there is a female hanging out with a male and it is in her experience that people often make assumptions of this manner when a male/female scenario exists.

10. This memorandum accurately summarizes the conversations between [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] on 10 and 12 August 2019.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

Subj: SUMMARY OF STATEMENT FROM CAPT TADD GORMAN, USN

1. On 10 and 12 August 2019, as Preliminary Inquiry Officer, I interviewed CAPT Tadd Gorman, USN, about his knowledge of possible inappropriate behavior involving USS ANTIETAM officers during a port visit to Manila, Philippines from 7-10 August 2019.

2. CAPT Gorman is the Commanding Officer of USS ANTIETAM.

3. CAPT Gorman assigned the (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) as his liberty buddy for the first night in port, 7 August. CAPT Gorman was not aware that the Department Heads considered the requirement to be CO's liberty buddy to be a measure designed to keep the CO out of trouble on liberty. On 7 August, CAPT Gorman and (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) went to the mall to shop and then went to dinner. CAPT Gorman stated that he forgot to bring his bag when departing for liberty so he had to go back to the ship. Based on dense traffic, the trip back to the ship to retrieve his bag took over an hour so CAPT Gorman decided to stay on the ship for the first night, even though he had paid for a hotel room and already checked into the hotel room that night. (I would like to comment that the night before had been the strait transit, I had a major fuel oil leak at 3am, and the pierwork of making up the ship took a very long time and was challenging due to having to wait in the inner harbor over an hour for a barge to clear our berth. I was pretty exhausted to start with and didn't to make the over hour long trip back).

4. On the second afternoon in port, 8 August, CAPT Gorman met up with (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) at a brewery. The three of them remained at the brewery for the rest of the day drinking beers and eating. CAPT Gorman's driver brought the (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) back to their hotel and then he returned to his hotel, the Shangri-La. (Correction here: My driver dropped me off at the brewery, but, (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) who was (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) paid driver returned us to our hotels. Me to Shangri-La and them to their hotel.)

5. (I would first like to say that shortly before this interview I had been informed that (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) I was distraught and distracted and it doesn't appear that I clearly or effectively communicated.) On 9 August, CAPT Gorman checked out of his hotel room but was unable to find a new hotel room for the last night of overnight liberty. (The previous statement is slightly disjointed as I didn't look to get a new room until that night). CAPT Gorman spent the entire day and overnight in lounge areas at the Shangri-La. CAPT Gorman does not recall specifically making any plans to meet up with any liberty buddies and stated that he spent the entire day by himself at the Shangri-La, although there were other ANTIETAM officers that he did see during the day. (I thought I had clarified that I didn't recall making plans to go out that evening with liberty buddies as it was originally going to be the big top event which was cancelled. I thought I did clarify that I had made plans to go shopping for the Embassy event during the day, but those plans did not occur). Beginning in the early afternoon on 9 August, CAPT Gorman spent time at the Sage Bar on the 4th floor of Shangri-La and at a lounge by the pool. CAPT Gorman stated that he did not leave the hotel complex the

entire day or night despite not having a room at the hotel for the night of 9 August. CAPT Gorman did not return to the ship on the night of 9 August. (I clarified on 12 AUG that I didn't want to present the optic of me returning to the ship by myself after curfew.) CAPT Gorman stated that he was not with the (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) on the night of 9 August (As above, I did not have plans to go out on liberty with (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) or the (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) that night, but did meet them during the day at the Shangra-La complex until they each departed to return to their hotel. They were not with me that night in the lobby as they had left for their hotels prior to me trying to get a room and realizing I lost my phones).

6. On the morning of 10 August, CAPT Gorman stated that he sat out by the pool of Shangri-La and talked to some ANTIETAM Sailors. He did not receive multiple phone calls from his XO or from RADM Thomas because he lost his Philippine "burner" cell phone. CAPT Gorman stated that he returned to ANTIETAM by 0900. (I believe I left around 0900 or 1000 to return to the ship although, I don't remember the exact time. It was in the morning.)

7. CAPT Gorman discussed his relationship with the XO indicating that, in his opinion, (b) (6), (b) (7)(C)

8. When asked to provide more details about his behavior on 9 August, CAPT Gorman admitted his explanation likely sounded sketchy. (reflecting on the disjointed discourse) He explained that he could not get a new hotel room and lost both his Japanese and Filipino cell phones. (this was after (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) had each left and I had also searched the area around the Sage and the Lounge.) He searched lost and found but could not find them. (I also clarified that at that point I didn't want to present the optic of me returning to the ship by myself after curfew. So I elected to remain in the lobby and common areas of the hotel complex until the morning.) He then hung out in the hotel lobby until 6 or 7 in the morning and then departed for the ship between 9 and 10am. CAPT Gorman adamantly denies the existence of an inappropriate relationship with (b) (6), (b) (7)(C)



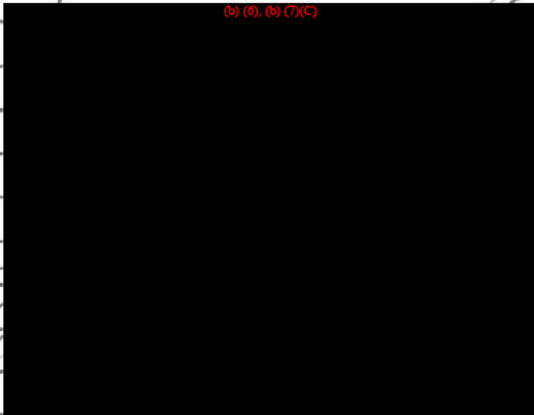

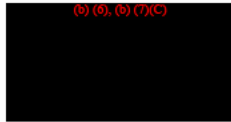
